
Anna achieved a 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the U11s. Amarra achieved a 2<sup>nd</sup> best girl in the U9s.

Dragonfly Class have been superstars all week: working incredibly hard on all their SATs papers and being really positive. All the adults who have worked with them have been impressed with their fantastic attitude and enormous effort. We are incredibly proud of them. The end of SATs was celebrated with cake, weeding, shed tidying, building new football goals and a fantastic DVD and duvet day!





As a school we have been using a PSHE scheme called Jigsaw. The scheme brings together personal, social, health and economic education, emotional literacy, social skills and spiritual development in a weekly lesson.

It is a whole school approach and it provides a 'mindful' approach to PSHE. Each week classes have a dedicated Jigsaw session that begins with the ringing of a chime and everyone focussing on their breathing. It aims to create a relaxed and safe environment so children feel empowered to speak about the ever-changing world and their role within it.

### **Calming technique**

Sit in a chair and place both feet on the ground. Keeping a straight back, close your eyes, place your hands on your tummy and breathe in through your nose and out through your mouth. Continue to breathe gently in and out until your shoulders relax and you feel calm. The children all enjoy their Jigsaw sessions and have learnt to use many of the calming and relaxation techniques in other areas of their learning. We have included one of these techniques below. Please continue to look at class pages on the website as these will have Jigsaw updates over the next few days.

### **Year 1 Phonics Information Session**

Year 1 parents are invited to an information session on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> May at 2.40pm. Mrs Cable will explain the Year 1 phonics screening due to take place in the second week after half-term. Please do come along.


#### **Auction of Promises**
