Together in Voice at Wells Cathedral

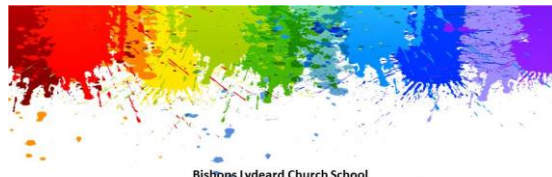

Travelling book fair

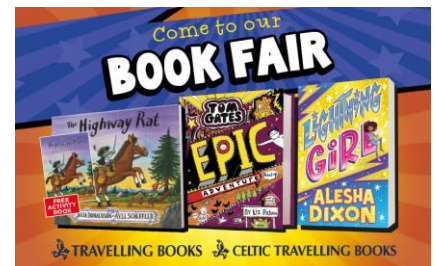
The Travelling Book Fair will be in the school hall as follows:
