Maths and English updates

Ladybird	Next week in Maths we will be working on number problems that involve sharing. In English we will be creating innovated stories of Jack and the Beanstalk.
Hedgehog	In English we are working on writing questions and exclamations and punctuating them correctly. In Maths we are working on place value.
Rabbit	In English we will be learning a new story called The Door In The Mountain. In Maths we will be using cm and metres to explore measuring.
Fox	Next week in English, we will be writing our own dilemma stories using paragraphs and direct speech. In Maths, we will be learning to recognise, describe and draw 2D and 3D shapes with a focus on the angles and lines of symmetry.
Owl	We will be continuing our work on the text The Shaman's Apprentice. In Maths we will be finishing our unit on time and looking forward to exploring shape.
