Final call for Years 5 and 6 sponsorship money – please bring to the school office on Monday 1st July. Many thanks for your generous donations so far.

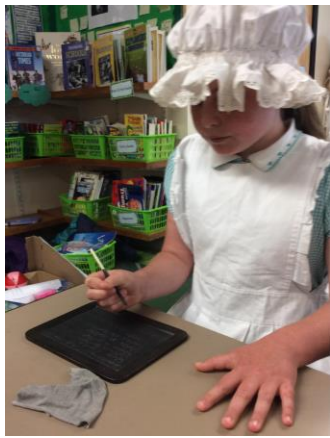
After School Spanish Club

Maths and English updates

Ladybird	In English the children will be writing their very own stories with new characters and settings. In Maths we will be focusing on 2D and 3D shapes.
Hedgehog	In Maths we are continuing to work on Time. In English we are working on applying capital letters to pronouns.
Rabbit	Rabbit class will be planning and writing their own adventure stories in English. In Maths, we will be learning to use efficient methods to solve problems.
