BLSA Update

The BLSA committee met on Wednesday 20th November for the AGM, and we are delighted to announce that we raised £5,199 last year – all of which is going to the school.

A massive thank you to you all for your support.

In the last year we have donated money to the early years' outdoor space (and are awaiting to hear if our lottery bid has been successful for an extra £10,000).

Some of the other items we have funded include: **licences for music and times table rockstars**, **help with funding the year 6 trip to Parliament**, **our annual first aid day** (set up by committee member, Lucy Chalkley), the **Samba band**, **Space exploration day**.

Over the last four years our large projects have included: purchasing the trim trail, the complete re-design, fit out and stocking of the library and classroom reading areas, provision of a suite of iPads.

Before the AGM we had two new parents/guardians express an interest in joining us, which is fantastic, thank you to them, it really is appreciated.

We are still a really, really small committee and therefore we have decided, **until we can get further volunteers** to help out, that we are going to limit activity for the next school year. We really regret that we have to do this, but we do not have the time as a committee to put on all of the events that we have done previously.

We have therefore decided to concentrate on one event per term, in addition we will be continuing to write bids for grants – which is where we can see that we can get the biggest return on our time.

The events that we are going to hold are:

Christmas disco – 13th December

Easter Chocolate Bingo – 27th March

Sponsored Olympic themed event – Summer Term

Unless we can get a bigger committee there will be no summer fete, no further discos, no movie nights, no ice cream Fridays. This will also have an impact on the amount of money we will be able to raise for our children and their school.

Maths and English updates

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We will be colour mixing and continuing with the story Brown Bear Brown Bear What Do You See? and
using it to help support our learning. In Maths we will be working on 1 more and 1 less in Maths. We will
be revisiting single sounds and using ng and nk.
In English we will be innovating and changing the story of Monkey See Monkey Do. In Maths we will be
exploring reading, writing and counting to 20.
n Maths we will continue to explore money using addition and subtraction. We will be problem solving,
finding out how much change to give when buying items. In English we will be innovating our new Talk
for Writing text of The Magic Brush where we will change one part of the text and re-write it in our own
way.
We are finishing innovating and starting to invent our own warning tales. In Maths we are multiplying and
dividing numbers by 3 and 4.
This week, Owl class will be writing reports. Our skills focus will be: headings, sub-headings,
subordinating conjunctions and writing in the present perfect. In Maths, we will be consolidating our
earning from the term. This week we will be going over subtracting 3 digit numbers using multiple
exchanges.
In Maths this week we will continue looking at multiplication and division with a focus on prime, square
and cubed numbers. In English we will be continuing to write and edit our innovated wishing tales and
then sharing them with the class.
This week we will be applying the skills of careful word choice and figurative language in our writing. In
Maths we will be solving a range of problems using written methods for all 4 operations.
