#### **Barvember**

As a school we join with many other children across the country taking part in 'Barvember'. During the month of November, White Rose Maths Hub release 5 problems a day that can be solved by representing the information in the problem as bar models.

These bar model representations support children to be able to decide which calculations are needed to solve the problem. Solving word problems and visual problems is one strand of problem solving that we teach in school. Using bar models is a fantastic strategy for solving these types of problems.









Dragonfly Class revisited their learning about different bar model representations at the start of the week and will continue to build their skills across the month of November and beyond.
