You may be aware from media coverage that the NEU teaching union has declared strike action, which will take place on dates through February and March. The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teacher's pay.

On attendance:

At Bishops Lydeard Church School, the education of every child in our school is of the utmost importance to us. We want each child to be able to fulfil their potential and leave our school being the best they can be. There are many ways this can happen, but one of the main ways is children being in school, on time, every day.

In line with current guidance and legislation, schools may only authorise term-time leave in exceptional circumstances. We understand the importance of family time and the difficulties in rearranging holidays which were delayed or cancelled by the pandemic, however we must inform you that term-time holidays will not be authorised.

Please be aware that unauthorised absences may result in the Local Authority issuing you with a Penalty Notice. Penalty notices can be issued to each parent for each child when term-time leave is taken.

# Pupil Premium explained for Parents: Is your child entitled?

### Which pupils qualify for free school meals?

Your child may be eligible for free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance=
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit

#### What are the benefits of claiming free school meals?

School meals are a good way to ensure that your child eats well at lunchtime, and they can also save you time and money.

Claiming free school meals also helps the school. We get extra funding, known as the 'pupil premium', for every eligible pupil who is registered.

#### What is the pupil premium?

The pupil premium grant is funding provided to schools to help all pupils reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation.

Pupils may be eligible if they:

- Are registered for free school meals.
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point since May 2010.
- Are, or have been, in care.
- Have parents in the armed forces.

#### How is the pupil premium funding used?

The pupil premium is not used to pay for school meals. Schools use the funding to improve the attainment of pupils who are eligible.



#### How can I ensure the school gets the funding?

The more eligible pupils that are registered for free school meals, the more funding the school receives.

Registering does not mean your child has to take up free school meals if they

don't want to.
