
Dear Parents and Carers.

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Each month there is a trail around the library with pictures for children to find, with a little prize for finding them all – May's will have a royal theme.

Also in May, to celebrate the Royal Coronation, there will be activities on the table for children – making a crown or something similar.

►News

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The library has recently received a new delivery of adult audio books – there are now 2 full shelves of them, fiction and non-fiction. You don't require any special equipment to listen to them, just an AAA battery and some headphones. The device is very small, about as big as a pack of cards, so it's very portable and can be put in a pocket, while you work, exercise or travel. There is a small charge to borrow the adult audio books.

Feature – Blood Pressure Monitors

Apharmacist:

- to give a more accurate picture of what your blood pressure is like as you go about your daily <u>life;</u>
- to see if your blood pressure is higher at the doctors' surgery than it is at home;
- to allow you to see how your treatment is working for you;
- to alert your GP to unexpected changes in your readings, helping them to adjust your medications if required.

The library has 2 blood pressure monitors, which can be loaned for 2 weeks at a time. There is no charge to borrow a monitor, or to join the library. The monitors are in a pouch, with full instructions on use, and a borrow are to give to your GP/pharmacist, if requested.
