Please keep reading our newsletters and other information shared to find out what is happening in school and how we are enhancing our educational offer throughout the year.


On behalf of Mr Beament and myself, thank you for being part of our school community. We are excited about the opportunities that lie ahead, and we look forward to working with you all.

Ladybird Class

The children have enjoyed exploring a variety of learning opportunities in their continuous provision as well as developing their communication and language skills. It has been lovely to see them all working together so well and taking pride in their environment.





Jigsaw/PSHE: Ladybird class have been learning to be a part of a whole class team. We talked about what that looks to help everyone learn in class and then we did some team building activities to join us together. It was a lot of fun and a good challenge.

Rabbit Class

Science: Everyday materials.

In Science, we have been learning about everyday materials. We undertook a materials hunt around the school ground to help us identify what materials different items are made from. We made some fantastic observations about what we could see and named lots of materials accurately.

Maths: Place Value.

In Maths, we have been learning all about place value. We have become experts at understanding the concepts of 10s and 1s and how we can partition numbers in different ways. The children have enjoyed using a variety of different resources to help them.





Owl Class

Music: We looked at playing simple rhythmic and melodic patterns on a variety of percussion instruments. We discussed the similarities of a Xylophone and Glockenspiel and how they sound so different. We looked at different beaters before the children worked in groups to create their own melodic patterns. They had lots of fun and were very creative with the instruments and patterns made.





English: In our invent week for English, we have been looking at writing following the same story structure as our core text 'Ben and the Stolen Diamond'. Last week we innovated it to 'Charlie and the Climbing Wall'. Our whole class example follows a young, mean and ruthless boy called Bruce who goes on an adventure deep into a snow-capped mountain cave and discovered a dinosaur egg. In our writing we have been focussing on using contractions, fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases.

Example of some sentences written this week:

'Jack was a shy, young boy who lived in a colossal house with lots of money.'

'As quick as a flash, her eyes fell upon three shiny, small chicken eggs in a nest made of hay.'

'Sneakily, she started to grab the film. Her hand stretched closer and closer until she couldn't stretch anymore.'

Badger Class



In Computing last week in Badger Class, we explored Purple Mash's 2Code Gibbon programme. We created backgrounds and objects and edited their attributes using the given tools. We then created blocks of code to make our objects move and respond in various different ways to actions coded into the algorithm.



In PE, Badger class played invasion games. Our focus of the term is Hockey. These photos show the class learning to hold a hockey stick correctly and invade a space against a defender. They were amazing, listened well and were safe!!



Dragonfly Class

In Science this term we are exploring forces and magnets. To start our learning we used our scientific skills to investigate how different surfaces affected the movement of a toy car. We had to make sure we investigated scientifically by keep most variables the same and only changing the surface used. We also had to make sure that we were accurate with our measuring.



School Library

They can often been seen turning books around so that the spines can be seen, organising books by the same author or in the same series and making sure that all the coloured books match up. Thermal Imaging Camera Loan Scheme

After last year's successful pilot scheme in South Somerset Libraries, the Thermal Imaging Camera Loaning Scheme is launching across all Somerset Libraries (including Community Libraries). The scheme enables customers to borrow an easy-to-use camera unit that connects directly to your smartphone or tablet (Android or Apple) and will provide you with a thermal image of your home or building. The image can then be used to interrogate and identify potential improvements, such as requirements for insulation and draught proofing within your home to improve your energy efficiency, as well as to reduce heat loss and fuel bills.

The cameras will be available soon to request for free from any Somerset library by a Somerset library user (with full adult membership) and can be borrowed for up to 3 days (renewals are not permitted).

Things to do: There is a trail of pictures for children to find, with a little prize for finding them all. There are also activities for children – colouring, lego, duplo and jigsaws.
