


DT and History

Since September, the children have been learning about Brunel and the impact his designs have had on the UK and overseas. In particular, we looked at the bridges he designed, such as the Clifton Suspension Bridge in Bristol.

We paid a visit to Bristol to learn all about how the Clifton Suspension Bridge was designed and built. The children were even given the opportunity to design and build their own bridges using a range of materials.

We had an absolutely brilliant day out which has helped contextualise our learning.









Years 5 and 6 Trip to Clifton Suspension Bridge

DT and History with a little bit of Geography, French, Maths and Science too!

Year 5 and Year 6 enjoyed a fantastic day visiting Clifton Suspension Bridge. They took part in a guided tour of the bridge which explored the history of the Clifton Suspension Bridge, the involvement of Brunel and an explanation of how suspension bridges are constructed to withstand load and span distances. The tour involved some fantastic acting from children who took on the roles of people like Thomas Telford, Brunel, Brunel's parents and other designers. They were brilliant. The children also completed a bridge building workshop which allowed them to apply their learning from DT in school about the features of bridges and ways to strengthen and reinforce them. They became designers and engineers with various materials including Lego, chains, string and lolly sticks to see if their bridge would successfully hold a 1 kg weight. It really was an amazing day. A huge thank you to the parent helpers who made the trip possible.









Bar models

Owl Class


Maths






Dragonfly Class


Maths
