

### **Ladybird Class**

### English

This week the Ladybird class have had lots of fun with their English wow lesson. The children got to explore an undersea tray where they all had the opportunity to try and guess what our new text was. Children loved playing with the water, sand and sea animals. We collected lots of ideas and new vocabulary.



### Science

For this year's science week we looked at how quickly different jelly sets and whether the water temperature or adding fruit affected the time. Everyone made their own predications and we all thoroughly enjoyed making the jelly. The children also enjoyed tasting the jelly at the end.









### **Rabbit Class**

#### World Book Day

Rabbit Class had a fantastic day celebrating World Book Day. We enjoyed discussing our favourite books and even creating our own portals to where different books are based! The children looked amazing in their costumes and we had fun guessing who everyone was.

#### Maths

In maths, we have done some amazing learning about multiplication and division. The children have been fantastic at using their knowledge of equal groups and counting in 2's, 5's and 10's to understand different multiplication and division questions, the children also enjoyed representing these in different ways.















## **Owl Class**

### World Book Day

We journeyed to new lands through our stories. In art we created doorways to our book and behind the door was the setting for one of our favourite stories. These ranged from woodland walks to outer space adventures and everything in between! It was so lovely to see all the amazing costumes the children came dressed in and the brilliant descriptive writing they wrote about their favourite books.







### Music

We learnt how to play C D and E notes as an accompaniment to a nursey rhyme using pitched or rhythmic ostinatos. We then moved onto learning about musical rests and even managed to play an entire nursery rhyme as table groups, thinking about time keeping, note duration and rests. After that, they then begun to create their own musical accompaniment to well-known songs.



## **Badger Class**

### Jigsaw

In this lesson, Badger learnt about basic emergency aid procedures (including the recovery position) and practiced how to get help in emergency situations.



Science Week

It's British Science Week and the theme is Time. So Badger, being the scientists they are, crafted a solargraphy camera that will use the sun's exposure to develop a photograph over 6 months. After we each made our cameras, we placed them around the school field, where they will stay until after the summer holidays. We can't wait to see the results!





### **Dragonfly Class**



World Book Day Dragonfly Class enjoyed coming dressed up as a character from a book and sharing their character with others. We used our class book 'Impossible Creatures' to travel into the world created in the book - The Archipelago and used this in some descriptive writing and artwork during the day.



### Science

In Science we have been exploring what sound is and how sound travels. We used different instruments to observe how the sound was made - we added rice to a drum skin and on a note on the glockenspiel to see the vibrations in action. As Scientists we observed carefully and asked questions about what we saw, why it might be happening and how it could be changed.

### Music

In Music we have been learning to read stave notation and to perform simple tunes on a glockenspiel. We worked in pairs so one could count and clap a steady beat and give advice to make the playing the best it could be. We have been really impressed by our performances.



#### Science Week

We celebrated Science Week and its theme of Time with an investigation using a pendulum. The question we investigated was: How does the size of a piece of card affect the length of time a pendulum swings? We were able to revisit our learning about forces and in particular air resistance. We had to investigate which length of string and which angle to start the pendulum swinging gave an effective length of time swinging - not too long and not too short. We were then able to attach different

sized pieces of card. We tried to change the size of the card using a pattern to see if that would lead to a pattern in our results. It was great fun!
