Nursery





The nursery children have been learning about repeating patterns. They first made a pattern with cubes, using only two colours. Then they painted the pattern onto their 'caterpillar'.







The children were being scientists this week. They explored magnetism, finding different places where the magnetic building blocks would 'stick'.







Ladybird Class

English

The ladybird class really enjoyed the WOW that we created for our new story in English. We found lots of giant footsteps around the school and playground as well as some shiny coins and a big golden egg. We spent time trying to work out who we thought had visited our school.





Maths

This week the reception children have been learning all about directions and how to give clear instructions. We blind folded some of the children whilst the other children had to give clear directions to help direct them around the classroom.





Rabbit Class

Maths

In maths, we have started learning about time. The children have enjoyed exploring telling the time using the vocabulary of 'o'clock' and 'half past'. The children used clocks to make a time for their partner to read and used a handy little rhyme to help them know which way the hands go!



Geography

This term in Geography, we are exploring the question 'What makes Africa amazing?' The children enjoyed immersing themselves in the culture of Africa and learning some traditional African dance moves.







Owl Class

Maths

We have begun our unit of learning on Time. We had a great start to our unit using the clocks to show given times. We looked at how the hour hand always moves too and used our fraction knowledge to split the clock and the hour intervals into quarters.



Geography

Our topic focus for this term is 'Food, Glorious Food!' We have begun by looking at countries in Europe and South America. In this lesson, we used the Atlases to label the countries in South America and key features. We will be moving onto looking at food miles and produce we eat that comes from South America.



Badger Class

Geography

This term we are diving into a Geography unit that focuses on South America, in particular its physical and human features, biome and trading links. But to understand the locale of South America, the children reactivated knowledge about the continents of the world, including Europe. They used an Atlas to understand where the European countries were in relation to each other.



Maths

Understanding volume is a tricky thing, which is why Badger class used cubes to help them visualise the volume of an object in cm cubed. It was great to have a hands-on maths lesson with physical representations.



Dragonfly Class

Art

Having explored different ways of shaping and joining clay and experimenting with making coil pots and thumb pots, Dragonfly Class - at the end of last term - created pots in the more geometric style of Alison Britton. This term they painted them with designs similar to those of Alison Britton. It was fantastic to see the care when making and decorating and the end results were amazing.





Music

This term Dragonfly Class are applying their learning to compose and perform their own music. They wrote rhythm music with at least 3 different layers and performed these as a group in time with a steady beat. It took a lot of focus to read the music and perform their part independently of others but sounded fantastic when put together.

ELSA stands for Emotional Literacy Support Assistant. ELSA support is designed to help schools support the emotional needs of their pupils.

ELSAs are trained by educational psychologists to plan and deliver programmes of support to pupils who may be experiencing temporary or long term additional emotional needs, such as anxiety, grief, issues with emotional control, selfesteem and so on. It acknowledges that children and young people learn best when they feel happier and their emotional needs are being addressed.
